In this expressive arts institute, we will engage in individual and community art-making to explore the practice of attending to the creative process in life and in therapy. Studio workshops integrating clay movement, poetry, music, writing, and performance invite artistic inquiry and renewal. As we interweave expressive arts theories with studio art-making throughout this course, we will examine possibilities for creating our way through a changing landscape and nourishing presence and imagination in our personal and professional work.

This intensive institute is offered both as a graduate course in the Department of Human Development & Psychological Counseling and as Continuing Education through the National Board of Certified Counselors (28 Continuing Education Clock Hours available). Personal process hours for those seeking the Registered Expressive Arts Therapist (REAT) & Registered Expressive Arts Consultant Educator (REACE) credentials through the International Expressive Arts Therapy Association will be available. Students wishing to take the course for credit should register online. Non-credit students do not need to register separately through the university.

For all participants there is a \$260.00 fee for room, board and materials. This fee (plus the \$400 if a non-credit student) must be paid **March 1, 2015** to secure your place in the institute and to enable you to register. Wildacres is situated on 1,600 acres at an elevation of 3,300 feet atop Pompey's Knob, a mountain near the Blue Ridge Parkway in Little Switzerland, North Carolina. (See map below.) Wildacres is a conference center offering its facilities to non-profit groups that conduct educational or cultural programs and seminars.

Directions To Wildacres from Marion, NC

Go north on Hwy. 226-221, 6.3 miles from the Hwy. 70 intersection (Wal-Mart is on the left). Take a left on Hwy. 226 toward Spruce Pine. (This intersection has a traffic signal.) Go 1.1 miles to the intersection of Hwy. 226 and 226A and go straight on 226A. Take this road 6.5 miles to the Wildacres sign at Wildacres Road on the left. Go 1.1 miles on gravel road to a paved drive on the right leading to Wildacres.

Directions To Wildacres from Spruce Pine, NC

Take Highway 226 to the Blue Ridge Parkway, across from the Minerals Museum, and turn left onto the Parkway ramp. At the stop sign, turn right to go south on the Parkway. Go about six miles on the parkway and turn left at Gooch Gap. This is between mileposts 336 and 337. Turn right onto the gravel road and go about 7/10th of a mile to the paved driveway on the left leading to Wildacres.
